George Washington and 1776

This lesson introduces the students to a variety of different sources. Students will analyze primary source documents, read three chapters from the books <u>1776 and</u> <u>Rediscovering George Washington Founding Father</u>, watch a video, answer questions and complete a project based learning assignment.

Objectives

- 1. To emphasis the importance of reading primary source documents in the study of history.
- 2. To analyze the role of George Washington during the early years of the American Revolution
- 3. Summarize the events surrounding the evacuation of Boston and the Battle of Trenton

Background

In the summer of 1775 George Washington was named Commander-in- Chief of the Continental army. Washington had experience serving with the British Army and had to form a new approach to warfare that was "not British like". Washington was encamped outside of Boston and did not have the artillery needed to engage the British Regulars. It was not until March of 1776 that Henry Knox brought guns from Fort Ticonderoga to Dorchester Heights overlooking Boston. The British decided to abandon Boston and transported troops and civilians to Halifax, Nova Scotia, leaving on March 17, 1776.

In the summer of 1776 Washington was driven from New York by Gen. Howe into New Jersey. Washington raised the morale of the Americans by raiding Trenton, New Jersey on Christmas Day 1776 and capturing 900 Hessians. He followed up that victory by defeating the British at Princeton on January 3, 1777.

Activities

Part 1: Establish historical context for the class.

- A. Have the students view the second video of the HBO mini series *John Adams*, focusing on the selection of Washington as commander in chief, Washington's Army encamped in Charlestown and Colonel Knox dragging the artillery by Abigail Adams
- B. Assign pages 17-45 in Brookhiser's <u>Founding Father</u>. Write a 2-3 page summary on the Authors view of Washington. Was he the right man for the leadership role? Was he a successful general? Why or Why not?

Part 2: Evaluating Primary Sources

- A. Read the letter from John Bowater to the Earl of Denhigh, March 25, 1776. What reasons did Bowater give for the evacuation of Boston?
- B. Read the letter from Abigail Adams to John Adams "Remember the Ladies" March 1776. Summarize the thoughts of Abigail. How does she describe Boston Post-evacuation?
- C. Read A Tory view of the siege of Boston Peter Oliver: from" The origins and progress of the American Rebellion" Give a chronological account on the British evacuation based on this reading.

Prepare to discuss each primary source in class

Part 3: Dorchester Heights

- A. Watch The A&E Video The American Revolution Video number 2 and answer guided questions
- B. Assignment: Read Chapter 3 of the book <u>1776</u> by David McCullough
- C. Project Based Assignment 1. Hand draw a map of Boston and surrounding area, circa March of 1776 2. Write a diary entry for Colonel Knox discussing his journey from Ft. Ticonderoga to Boston. (at least 1 page) 3. Provide a visual as a primary source, map, artwork, etc. relevant to chapter 3 4. Provide a written primary source, journal, letter, diary, relevant to chapter 3 5. Write a one page biography on any person in this reading. 6. Write a letter from Gen. Howe to England explaining his reasoning for evacuating Boston. 7. Write a one page reflection on the chapter. Have fun be creative

Part 4: Evaluating primary Sources

- A. Read *The American Crisis number one* by Thomas Paine. Summarize Paine's views, points and concerns in this reading. Is this propaganda? Did Washington make a good decision reading this to his troops? Why?
- B. Read the letter from George Washington to Lund Washington, Dec 10 and 17, 1776 *The American Retreat: Pennsylvania, December 1776.* What was the state of the American Army? How was Washington Handling the Situation?
- C. Read the letter from George Washington to John Hancock December 1776. Summarize the Generals Letter.

Part 5: The Crossing/Trenton

- A. Watch the A&E Video The American Revolution number 3 and answer the guided questions
- B. Read Chapter 7 of the book <u>1776</u> by David McCullough
- C. Project based assignment: 1. A hand drawn map of Trenton and the surrounding area, circa December 1776 2. Write a diary entry for John Glover, discussing the crossing of the Delaware 3. Provide a visual as a primary source, map, artwork, etc., relevant to chapter 7 4. Provide a written primary source, journal, letter, diary, etc., relevant to chapter 7 5. Write a one page biography on any person in this reading. (not George Washington) 6. Write a letter from General Washington to the Continental Congress explaining his reason for the attack. 7. Write a one page reflection on chapter 7 Have fun be creative!

The project based assignments can be presented to the teacher in three ways.
